Walking together safely to and from school



Walking to school and back home again is a great way to spend time with your child and encourage safe and healthy behaviours.

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children safer as a pedestrian:

- talk with your children about being alert in the road environment. They need your help to spot dangers such as vehicles coming out of driveways.
- plan and practice your trip to school so you use pedestrian/children's crossings where possible
- hold your child's hand- on the footpath, in the car park and crossing the road. If a hand isn't available they should hold an arm, bag, clothes or the pram
- meet your child near the school gate and don't call them from across the road.
- remind your child to STOP! LOOK! LISTEN!
 THINK! every time they cross the road and keep checking until safely across.
- explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross.
