## Fire and Rescue Talk: A Valuable Lesson in Safety

On Thursday 22nd May, our school had the privilege of hosting a vital Fire and Rescue talk presented by Jacqueline, Stephen, and Howard. The session was informative and engaging, aimed at educating our students about fire safety and preparedness.

The firefighters spoke to the children about essential actions to take in the event of a fire. They emphasised the importance of being prepared, children knowing their own address, knowing how to call for help, and the critical step of getting down low and crawling out to avoid smoke inhalation. The team also showcased their equipment, allowing students to see firsthand the tools that help keep our community safe.

A key takeaway for the students was the importance of knowing their home address and the need to evacuate immediately in the event of a fire. Jacqueline, Stephen, and Howard highlighted that a home can become fully engulfed in flames in just three minutes, making quick action essential.

The firefighters reassured the children that there is no need to be scared when they see fire and rescue personnel in their gear. Their presence is to help and protect. We are grateful to the Fire and Rescue team for their time and commitment to keeping our students informed and safe!

- never call out to your child from across the road it is very dangerous


